ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

The undersigned, being a natural person of the age of eighteen years or more, does make and acknowledge these Articles of Incorporation for the purpose of forming a business corporation under and by virtue of the laws of the State of North Carolina, as contained in Chapter 55 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, entitled "Business Corporation Act," and the several amendments thereto, and to that end does hereby set forth:

ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation is THE OTHER PLACE, INC.

ARTICLE II

The period of duration of the corporation is perpetual.

ARTICLE III

The purposes for which the corporation is organized are:

- (a) To buy, sell and deal in antiques including furniture, glass, glassware, wearing apparel, jewelry, vases, books, coins, manuscripts, relics, statues, and any and everything which because of its age coupled with its design, make or rarity renders it of especial value apart from its usefulness. To repair and reconstruct antiques of every name and nature. To acquire such property, real and personal, as may be necessary to the conduct of such business and to conduct the business in the manner in which it is ordinarily conducted by others engaged in a similar business.
- (b) To own a financial interest in any business in which the corporation itself could lawfully engage.
- (c) To serve as an agent for any other person in the conduct of any business in which the corporation itself could lawfully engage.
- (d) To engage in any lawful act or activity for which corporations may be organized under Chapter 55 of the General Statutes of North Carolina.

ARTICLE IV

The corporation shall have authority to issue One Hundred Thousand (100,000) shares of common stock, having a par value of One Dollar (\$1.00) per share.

No holder of stock of the corporation shall be entitled as of right to subscribe for or purchase any additional or increased stock of the corporation of any class, whether now or hereafter authorized, including treasury stock, or obligations convertible into any class of stock, or stock of any class convertible into stock of any other class, or obligations, stock or other securities carrying warrants or rights to subscribe to stock of the corporation of any class, whether now or hereafter authorized, but any and all shares of stock, bonds, debentures or other securities or obligations, whether

convertible into stock or carrying warrants entitling the holders thereof to subscribe to stock, may be issued, sold or disposed of from time to time by authority of the Board of Directors of the corporation to such persons, firms or corporations and for such consideration, as far as it may be permitted by law, as the Board of Directors shall from time to time determine.

ARTICLE V

The sale of One Thousand (1,000) shares of common stock at the par value thereof shall be the minimum amount of consideration for its shares to be received by the corporation before it shall commence business.

ARTICLE VI

The address of the initial registered office of the corporation is 809 Fourth Street, Winston-Salem, Fc 'yth County, North Carolina, and the name of its initial registered agent at such address is Robert Edward Gant.

ARTICLE VII
